Village Late Spring Clean – Saturday 28 May from 9am

So that Ogbourne St George looks as good as it can for the Jubilee celebrations, we're calling on as many friends and residents as possible to help with our Village Spring Clean. We'll meet at Pooles Meadow at 8.45am to start at 9.00am and expect to finish around 12:00/12:30pm. Please volunteer your time for a few hours, then we can prepare the village before the Jubilee weekend commences.

- Split into working teams (number dependent) and work through a priority list of areas of the village to clear away overgrowth, prune back, litter pick etc.
- An A3 map with areas marked will be provided for each team.
- Please bring any of the following should you have them:

Gloves	Loppers and pruners	Brooms	Weeding tools
Shovels	Garden waste bags	High-vis vests	Strimmers

Areas to focus on:

- 1. The bus stop on the Marlborough Rd toward the BT exchange,
- 2. The bus stop on the old railway line path and
- 3. The bus stop on the slip road pedestrian access to the Golf Club.

Tasks to carry out:

- Clear all litter en route and in and around these areas
- Strim around the village signs
- Weed the flower boxes on the Marlborough/Aldbourne Road village entrances
- Strim footpath areas e.g. by Meadow Cottage.
- Other jobs are listed and will be people and time dependent.

Please come and help for a few hours or whatever time you can spare. Children also welcome to come and help clear up. The more hands on deck, the more we can get done done and ensure our village looks fit for a Queen! Thank you.

Jubilee Beacon Light Up – Thursday 2 June from 8pm

Ogbourne St George will kick off the Jubilee celebrations from 8pm on the evening of Thursday 2 June, by joining communities across the UK and Commonwealth in the lighting of a Jubilee Beacon as well as a firework display.

Located at the top of the hill on the road to Aldbourne, near Chase Woods Farm, the beacon will be lit in line with the rest of the Commonwealth nations at 9.45pm, followed by fireworks, finishing at 10pm. "The Nosebag" will be selling delicious burgers, baked goods, and hot and cold soft drinks from 8pm, and there will be games to pass the time until light up. There is parking available on site.

Big Jubilee Picnic on the Green – Sunday 5 June from 12pm

On Sunday 5th June our village will become part of The Big Jubilee Lunch by holding a village picnic on the green at Pooles Meadow. The bells will ring at the church from 11.30am for half an hour, and then starting from 12pm, residents are invited to bring their own picnic-filled hampers to tuck into and blankets to relax onto on the grass and join in.

Events and entertainment include a **Children's Design a Crown Competition** and a **Jubilee Bake Off for Children and Adults.** Please bring along your home-made crowns and bakes. The deadline for entries is 1.30pm with judging at 2pm. Prizes for the best Crown, best Children's Jubilee cake and best Adults' Jubilee Cake will be awarded, so let your creative jubilee juices flow!

Light games and activities including skittles and beanbags will take place on the lawn until 3pm. In addition there will be complimentary ice creams to cool us all down, and a special Platinum jubilee souvenir for all children attending.
