Their huge contribution to building our community and long-standing presence as hosts of such a warm welcoming place will be sorely missed. Quite simply the Inn has been crucial in enabling many of us to form firm friendships, make treasured memories and enjoy the best of times on our doorstep.

Like many rural pubs, the Inn has been adversely affected by the cost-of-living crisis, coming quickly on the back of a pandemic, and we have been lucky that Megan and Mike and their team have worked so hard to keep it going as long as they have, through increasingly difficult economic conditions beyond their control. Suffice to say that no one could have done more to sustain the Inn as a vital viable business and community hub than Mike and Megan over the years.

# **Ogbourne Locals Conquer the Race to the Stones**

Two intrepid Ogbourne St George residents took on and conquered the 2024 Race to the Stones, a gruelling 100km cross-country race across Britain's oldest path, the Ridgeway, from Lewknor to Avebury, in what is the UK's biggest Ultramarathon event and was held from 13-14 July.

Completing the challenge first was Jess White, starting at Lewknor at 6:30 in the morning, passing her own house after 81km at 3:10pm (ouch!), scorching through our village at 3:18pm, and then storming up Smeathes Ridge to Barbury.

Finally, she reached Avebury in the incredible time of 11 hours and 14 minutes, averaging seven minutes per kilometre for the whole event, which includes food and rest stops.

Next Phil Luker tackled the route raising money for the Ellen MacArthur Cancer Trust, which has supported his niece for the last 12 years following a leukaemia diagnosis when she was just five years old.

Ahead of his massive challenge, Phil said: "I'm 52 and not as fit as I was when I last did it six or seven years ago. BUT compared to what those battling childhood cancer and the impact it has on their longer-term future have to go through, it will be a walk in the park, albeit a long one with blisters no doubt!"

Phil crossed the finish line after an amazing 22 hours and 17 minutes having run past the Inn at 2.26am (sadly closed!). At the time of writing his achievement has raised over £2,250. If anyone would like to add to this, you can find his fundraising page at justgiving.com or use this link:

# **Village Hall Maintenance News**

The Village Hall Committee has, in recent weeks, noticed some blistering of the new exterior paintwork in patches along the whole length of the eastern wall of the Village Hall.

Discussions with the contractors concluded that simply repainting the patches would be unsatisfactory. Instead, all parties have agreed that the correct solution is to repaint the whole section, which will also permit the contractors to incorporate an improved undercoating layer. We were always aware that the eastern elevation was the more difficult one to tackle, but this solution should avoid such issues recurring. The repainting is covered under the contractors' warranty and will be done urgently (depending on weather), with the minimum of disruption to the pre-school when it returns in September.
