From Friday 22 to Sunday 24 April our local Inn will make Ogbourne St George the first port of call for celebrating our patron saint with a variety of events to entertain and challenge us all, with all proceeds being donated to the Prospect Hospice, Wroughton.

First, a challenge to all cooks in our village to produce an Ogbourne Pie. Your criteria are: you must use local produce and it must be able to be served cold. Pies will be judged at 8:30pm on Friday, and then the pub will add it to their menu, name check the winning cook, and donate 50p for every pie sold to the Prospect.

Next the Ogbourne Orienteering Course will take place on 23 April from noon-6pm. Entrance is £3, all of which goes to the Prospect. The two fastest times will be presented with a prize at 7pm on Saturday.

For something more cerebral, how about the St. George Quiz? Pick up a form for £1, complete it over the weekend and return it to the pub by 6pm on Sunday. All correct forms will be entered into a draw, and one lucky winner will be drawn at 7pm on Sunday, who will receive a £15 Inn with the Well voucher. All proceeds will go to the Prospect.
