Ogbourne St George Church News

Ogbourne St George Church has a new heating system, thanks to Earthline Ltd. Earthline has been associated with our Village for over 30 years, and Managing Director, Rod Coplestone was keen to give something back to the local community for its support over this time. St George's Church dates back to the 12th Century, and has been without a working heating system for some time, due to problems obtaining parts for the old, direct fired boiler. Earthline decided to donate a new £14,000 indirect LPG heating system, which was installed on 12 August. The new system will not only improve fuel consumption by up to 50%, it will also reduce emissions and will be better for the fabric of the building, thanks to the significantly improved air quality entering the church. Father Roger said, "we are very thankful to Earthline for funding a replacement unit, which will not only be more effective but also greener".
