Chiseldon Local History Group

Our next meeting is on 20 November 2024 in the Church Hall, Butts Rd, SN4 0NN at 7.30 p.m. on "The Abolition of the Slave Trade", presented by Martin Collinson. The Slave Trade Act 1807 prohibited the slave trade in the British Empire, and although it did not automatically emancipate those enslaved at the time, it did encourage British action to press other nation states to abolish their own slave trades. It took effect after 18 years of trying. However, slavery remained legal in most of the British Empire until the Slavery Abolition Act of 1833. Martin will take us through this with reference to the key personalities involved such as William Wilberforce and Henry Dundas.
