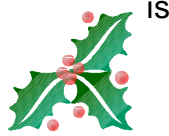


'Hello & Goodbye' (from the school newsletter)

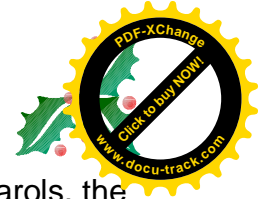


Vacancy – Catering Assistant, Ogbourne Primary School

It is so important for us all to try and resist the continuing commercialism which has become typical of the Christmas season.

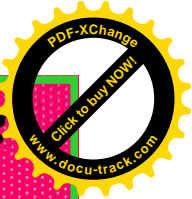
