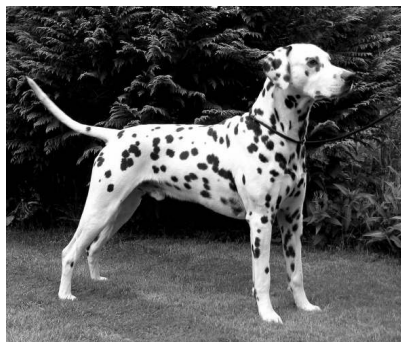
Sandison and Tim Jones: and the team that came third (pictured above) Barrie Reardon Smith, Ron Eley, Richard Thomas and Tom Heppell.
