- Minutes: The minutes of the last Annual Parish Meeting were signed.
- Matters arising: There were no matters arising
- Chairman's Report: *Report follows.* There were no questions on the Chairman's report.
- Financial Report: The Clerk reported that £5234.63 was brought forward from 2004/2005 which together with a precept of £3,500 and footway lighting grant of £497 meant the total available for the year was £9231.63. Expenditure of £4060.73 represented the basic costs of services within the Parish such as grass mowing and street lighting. £5170.90 was carried forward to 2006/2007. A resident asked if the financial position of the Parish Council could be displayed on the Notice Board. The Clerk stated that the income and expenditure were recorded on the Minutes after each meeting and any elector was welcome to request a current copy of the financial statement at any time.

- Stagnant Water There was a report of stagnant water in the field near the Kennels. Cllr Hunter agreed to arrange for a visit from Environmental Health.
- Car Parking There were further complaints of car parking at the junction of

High Street and Marlborough Road. The Clerk suggested that villagers should contact him or, alternatively, they should call the Police directly. Cllr Smith requested more copies of the Parking letter from the Clerk so he could put them on offending vehicles.

Motor Bikes

A villager raised the issue of motor bikes using the railway path and was concerned about young children on the bikes. Cllr Humphries commented that legally the path was liable to the same enforcement issues as any highway. Dangerous driving and underage driving should be reported.
